# **General Policies**

## **Internet Access**

All guest rooms include complimentary wireless internet access. Internet access is also available in the Presidential Inn business center with CAC enabled computers.

## **Linen and Towels**

Please do not remove linen or towels from our quarters. If you need additional linen or towels, please contact the front desk.

## **Lost and Found**

The lost and found section is maintained by the Housekeeping Manager in the Presidential Inn.

## **Maintenance**

Dial "0" from your room telephone.

## **Smoking Policy**

All rooms have been designated non-smoking. A minimum fee of \$150 will be charged if you smoke in a room. This will cover the cost of cleaning fabrics and carpets within the room.

## **Parking**

Please park in designated guest parking areas only. Please observe all parking signs. Vehicles in violation of this policy will be reported to Security Forces and may be towed at guest expense.

## **Safeguard Your Personal Belongings**

Guests are responsible for safeguarding their belongings. Money or high value items left lying around the room will be reported to management. Service will not be provided if money or high value items are left lying around the room. Guests who report the loss of "secure" personal property may file a claim against the government through the Base Legal Office.

## Fire Safety

Please adhere to the following:

- Do not smoke in the rooms.
- Do not burn candles, potpourri, or incense in rooms.
- Flammable liquids (gasoline, charcoal lighters, cleaning fluid etc.) are not allowed in the rooms.
- Additional cooking/heating devices (space heaters, hot plates) are unauthorized.
- Never leave heated cooking appliances unattended.
- Do not place hot appliances (irons, blow dryers, coffeepots, etc.) in drawers or cabinets.
- Do not overload electrical outlets. Multi-plugs and power strips are prohibited.
- Do not leave electrical appliances on when unattended.
- Practice good housekeeping (clean up messes, bag any dirty clothes, and keep wet clothes away from heat sources).

## Pet Policy

Pets are allowed in designated rooms only. Pet owners will be charged a \$10 fee per night regardless of how many pets. There will be a limit of 2 pets per unit. Pet owners must sign a pet agreement at check-in and provide a copy of current shot records. Housekeepers must enter the room daily to inspect for damages. There is a pet policy guideline located at the front desk to further answer any questions or concerns. In rooms other than pet friendly rooms, pets are unauthorized and a minimum \$150 fee will be assessed for violations.

- Rates are reviewed and subject to change annually.
- **Check in time is 1500. Check in time for TLFs is 1600.**
- **Check out time is at 1100.** Guests checking out late will be charged for an additional day unless prior arrangements have been made with the Lodging staff.
- Housekeeping service is provided daily to all rooms, unless the “Do Not Disturb” sign is placed on the outside of the door. If so, the housekeeper will return at 1100 hours to attempt housekeeping. If the sign is still out, no further attempt will be made until the next day. Bed linens are changed every seven days for long term guests.
- Rooms may be used for higher priority lodging guests as required by the Joint Base Andrews mission. In that event, guests will be referred to off base hotels; priority one guests will be given a letter of Non-Availability.

## Amenities

- Television, clock radio, microwave, coffee maker, and refrigerator are provided in all rooms.
- There are washing machines and clothes dryers in all facilities. These machines are provided free of charge to our guests.
- There are ice machines located in all facilities.
- Mail and packages will be received at the front desk. Guests should check with the desk periodically to see if they have received any. Attempts will be made to notify guests of mail, but please be aware that the desk clerk is not allowed to leave the desk to deliver mail or packages.
- A business center is available in the Presidential Inn (Bldg. 1380).
- Various sundry items are available in some lodging rooms. Additional sundry items are available at a reasonable price from the front desk. We welcome suggestions for additional resale products.
- We have complimentary secure storage space available in the Presidential Inn (Bldg. 1380) adjacent to the front desk. This space is for temporary personal use and IS NOT cleared to store classified items or funds.

# Guest Responsibilities

## **All occupants are responsible for:**

- Any damage to the rooms or furnishings.
- Cleaning the kitchenette area, refrigerator, stove, and dishes in your room during your stay. You may be subject to a minimum of \$150 cleaning fee upon checkout if these items are not left in satisfactory order.
- Ensuring personal items are not left on bed (housekeepers are not authorized to handle personal items, therefore; if items are left on beds the housekeepers will not make the bed).
- Ensuring quarters are kept neat and orderly at all items.
- Security of personal property. Money or high value items left lying around the room are reported to management. Services will not be provided if money or high value items are left lying around the room. Guests who report the loss of personal property may file a claim against the government through the base Legal Office at 301-981-5321.
- Reporting any problems with maintenance or otherwise to the front desk immediately.
- If you have a pet(s) in a non-pet friendly room, a minimum of \$150 cleaning fee will be assessed.
- Allowing housekeepers access to your room. For safety reasons the housekeepers are required to enter all quarters every third day, regardless of a "Do Not Disturb" sign on the outside of the door.
- Ensuring all items are accounted for upon check in/out. Guest will be charged market value plus a handling fee for any items missing such as utensils, hangers, towels, etc.
- Motorcycles, bicycles, and auto parts are not allowed in rooms or hallways.
- Firearms are not allowed in rooms. They may be stored with the Security Forces by calling the Law Enforcement Desk at 301-981-2002.
- Overnight non-paying visitors are not authorized in the quarters.
- When staying in our Temporary Lodging Facility (TLF), please control the activities of your children, and do not leave them unattended.
- Please do not use our towels and washcloths for cleaning your shoes, cars, etc. In most cases this ruins the item, and you will be charged for their loss. If you need rags, please contact the Front Desk by dialing ext. 0 on your room phone.

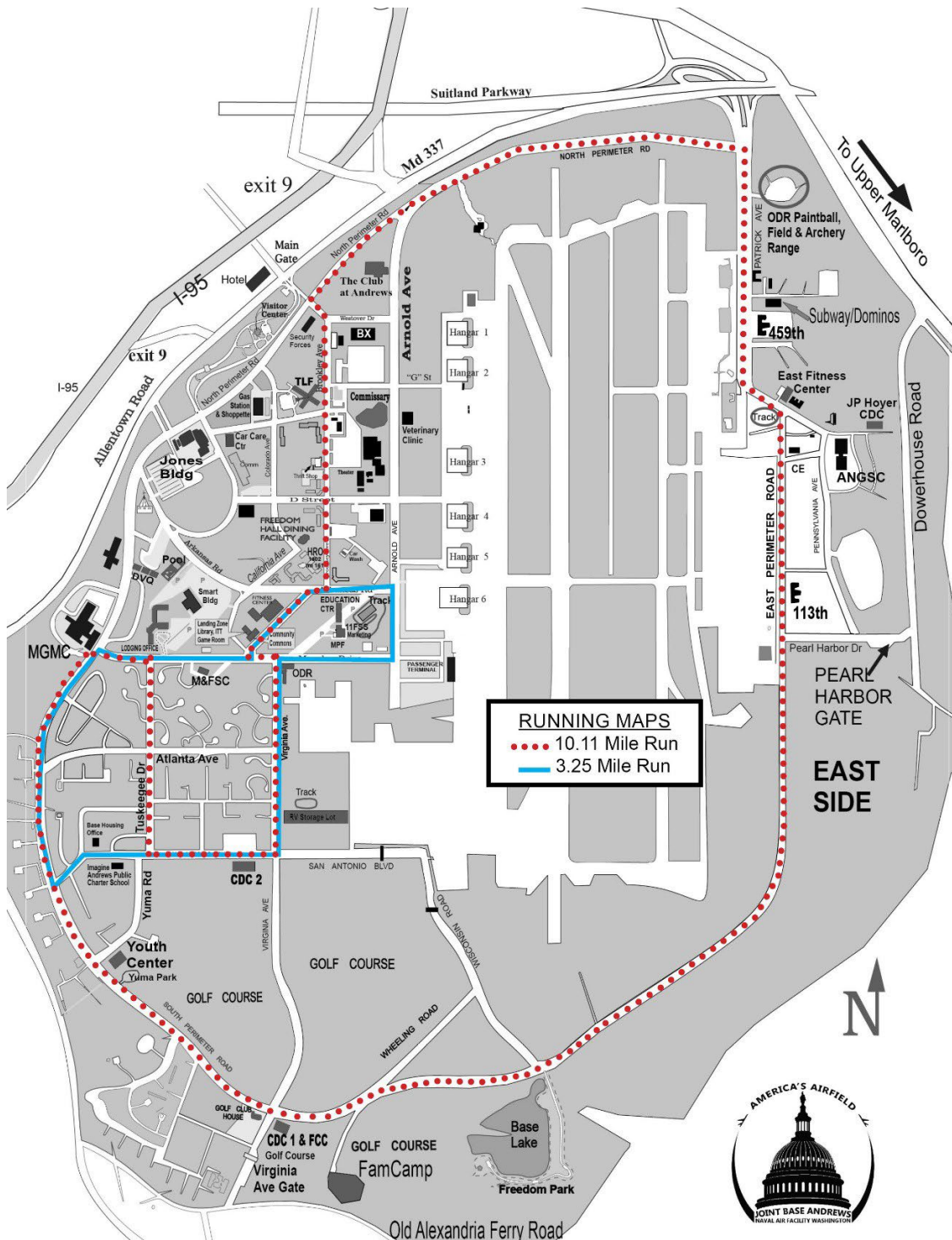

# History of Joint Base Andrews

Joint Base Andrews' origins date back to the Civil War, when the Union occupied a small country church as headquarters for soldiers camped nearby. Today, that church is known as Chapel Two, and the base community still uses it for worship services.

The present site of Andrews was often discussed in the early part of the 29th century as a potential civilian airfield. In August 1942, President Franklin D. Roosevelt ordered the Secretary of War to acquire the land and build a military airfield. Construction began later that year. April 19, 1943, the first permanent unit, the 463rd Base Headquarters and Air Base Squadron, arrived from Westover Field, MA, with 105 enlisted men and five officers.

Camp Springs army Air Field became operational May 2, 1943, when the first Republic P-47 Thunderbolt arrived; 75 other p-47s arrived that first month. The field's early mission was to train fighter pilots for overseas combat duty.

Camp Springs became Andrews Field May 2, 1945 to honor one of the Air Force's founding fathers, Lt. Gen. Frank M. Andrews.

Shortly after the Air Force became a separate service in 1947, the base's name changed to Andrews Air Force Base.

After WW II, Andrews served as headquarters for Continental Air Command, Strategic Air Command and the Military Air Transport Service, It was also headquarters to the Air Research and Development Command and its successor, the Air Force Systems Command, from 1950 to 1992.

The first permanently assigned jet-powered aircraft, an F-80 Shooting Star, arrived at Andrews in 1947. With the onset of the Korean War in June 1950, Andrews became involved in combat readiness training for B-25 medium bomber crews.

However, almost since its establishment, Andrews has been known for its Special Air Missions - the transportation of senior government and military leaders. President Harry S. Truman was the first to fly a presidential flight out of Andrews, November 24, 1946. In 1959, Detachment 1, 1254th Air Transport Group received its first jet aircraft, a VC-137. While the president's official aircraft, C-121, Columbine III, remained at Washington National in March 1962, and Andrews officially became "Home of Air Force One". In 1963, the Naval Air Facility moved to Andrews and is currently headquartered on the east side of the base.

Andrews has served as a solemn backdrop for national tragedy. After the November 22, 1963 assassination of

President Kennedy in Dallas, the president's body arrived at Andrews later that evening, accompanied by his widow Jacqueline B. Kennedy and newly sworn in President Lyndon D. Johnson. Thousands of mourners jammed the air terminal, including one of the largest gatherings of news media representatives ever assembled at any time on Andrews.

Andrews has also been the scene of many joyful returns and reunions. Among the many occasions, Andrews welcomed the first prisoners of war back from Vietnam in 1973, saw the return of US hostages from Iran in 1981, and welcomed former POW Army Private First Class Jessica Lynch home from Iraq in 2003.

The 89th Airlift Wing became the host unit for Andrews in 1991, continuing Andrews' rich history as the elite Air Mobility Command wing for transporting VIPs around the world. Andrews routinely provides service for America's senior officials as well as king, queens, presidents, prime ministers and military leaders from foreign nations.

In June 2004, the world watched as the remains of former President Ronald Regan arrived at Andrews for the state funeral services in Washington, DC. A few days later, thousands of mourners paid their respects on Andrews' flight line as President Regan's body departed for

California.

In June 2006, the 316th Wing, under the Air Force District of Washington, became the host unit of Andrews.

On October 1, 2009, Andrews Air Force Base joined Naval Air Facility Washington to become Joint Base Andrews Naval Air Facility Washington, or Joint Base Andrews.

In October 2010, the 316th Wing was inactivated and the 11th Wing, formerly the host wing at Bolling Air Force Base, was re-designated the host wing here at Andrews. The "Chief's Own" 11th Wing, while adopting the missions of Andrews, continues to oversee all operations of the Air Force Band, Honor Guard, and Chaplaincy, which are still located at Joint Base Anacostia/Bolling. The 11th Wing is proud to be host of the base bearing the name of one of the true founding fathers of today's most powerful air, space and cyberspace force.

Andrews today is also home to the Air Force District of Washington headquarters, the Air mobility Command's 89 AW, the 79th Medical Wing, the District of Columbia Air National Guard's 113th Wing, the Air Force Reserves' 459th Air Refueling Wing and several other partner units. Andrews has evolved from the muddy fields and wooden buildings of the 1940s to become one of the most modern air bases, and solidify itself as "The Gateway to the Nation's Capital".

# Lt. Gen. Frank M. Andrews

General Andrews was a significant figure in the early days of the Army Air Corps. He was often called "Marshall's Airman," referring to General of the Army George C. Marshall, who was the Army chief of staff. General Andrews was General Marshall's main advisor concerning aviation matters. Although General Andrews died in 1943, his influence with General Marshall and other senior military leaders played a pivotal role toward the ultimate establishment of a separate and independent Air Force in 1947.

General Andrews was born in Nashville, TN, Feb 3, 1884. In 1906, he graduated from the US Military Academy at West Point, NY, and received a second lieutenant commission in the cavalry. He served his first 11 years in the Philippines, Hawaii and other posts in the United States. Shortly after the US entered WWI in 1917, General Andrews was transferred to the Signal Corps for duty with the Aviation Division.

The future general earned his wings in 1918, and then held a number of Air Service and Air Corps staff and command billets. General Andrews worked in the War Plans Division of the War Department General Staff before transferring to Europe in August 1920. There, he served as Air Service officer, American Forces in Germany. Later, General

Andrews took over as assistant officer in charge of Civil Affairs, Headquarters American Forces in Germany. He returned to Washington, DC in early 1923, for duty in the office of the Chief of Air Service.

In 1933, General Andrews assumed command of the famed 1st Pursuit Group at Selfridge Field, MI. In 1934, he reported for special duty in Washington to help prepare plans for consolidating all air combat units under a prototype "Air Force", co-equal with the Air Corps, which directed all non-combat air functions. That prototype became General Headquarters, and March 1, 1935, General Andrews became the commanding general- with a temporary rank of brigadier general- of the newly established GHQ Air Force at Langley Field VA. While there, he was instrumental in the development of a modern bomber force. He earned the temporary grade of major general, but General Andrews' persistence to purchase large numbers of the B-17 lost him favor with senior military leaders. In early 1939, he reverted back to the permanent rank of colonel and was sent to Fort Sam Houston, TX, as air officer of the Eighth Corps Area.

In July 1939, General Marshall became acting Chief of Staff of the Army. He summoned General Andrews back to Washington, appointing him Assistant Chief of Staff for Training and Operations and promoting him to the permanent grade of brigadier general. It was the first time in military history that an Airman was appointed as one of the four assistant chiefs of staff on the Army General Staff.

In November 1940, General Andrews assumed command of the newly established Panama Canal Air Force, and later, the Caribbean Defense Command. He arrived in Cairo, Egypt, to assume command of the Army in the Middle East in 1942. At the Casablanca Conference in January 1943, Allied Forces leaders determined time had come to establish a separate European Theater of Operations. General Marshall proposed that General Andrews command it.



In February 1943, General Andrews assumed command of US Forces in the European Theater of Operations. A few months later, on May 3, 1943, he died in an aircraft accident off the coast of Iceland. General Marshall delivered the eulogy at a memorial service in Washington, saying that Frank Andrews was one of the Army's few great captains.

March 31, 1945, Mrs. Jeanette "Johnny" Andrews visited Camp Springs Army Air Field, MD, for the dedication ceremony to rename the installation Andrews Field in honor of her late husband. When the Air Force finally became a separate service on September 18, 1947, as General Andrews had so long advocated for, the base was assumed the designation -- Andrews Air Force Base.

## Colonel Todd E. Randolph

Colonel Todd E. Randolph is the Commander of the 316th Wing and Installation Commander for Joint Base Andrews-Naval Air Facility Washington, Maryland. As the host wing for Joint Base Andrews, the 316th Wing provides security, personnel, contracting, finance, medical and infrastructure support for five wings, three headquarters, and over 80 tenant organizations, as well as 60,000 Airmen and families in the National Capital Region and around the world. Additionally, the 316th Wing supports contingency operations in our nation's capital with immediate response rotary assets. It also provides security for the world's highest visibility flight line and is responsible for operations of the Air Force Memorial and the Air Force Arlington Chaplaincy.

Prior to this assignment, Colonel Randolph was the Commander, 27th Special Operations Mission Support Group at Cannon Air Force Base, New Mexico. The 27 SOMSG provides base support and services activities to ensure mission readiness of the 27th Special Operations Wing, including facility construction and maintenance, housing, food service, law enforcement, fire protection, explosive ordnance disposal, disaster preparedness, communications, personnel support, lodging, recreation, supply, contracting, transportation, logistics plans and other base services supporting 6,500 military personnel, civilian employees, their families and 6,000 retirees for all units and associated organizations on Cannon.

Colonel Randolph hails from Baltimore, MD where he enlisted in the Air Force in 1989. After completing Basic Military Training and Technical School, he served 11 years in the Mental Health career field before earning his commission as a Distinguished Graduate from Officer Training School in 2000. His experiences include

assignments as Section Commander, Flight Commander, Executive Officer and Deputy A1 at the Numbered Air Force level, and Executive Officer for the Air Force Air Demonstration Team, the "Thunderbirds". Additionally, while assigned to the Secretary of the Air Force, Inspector General's office, he served on a 365-day deployment as the US Forces-Iraq, Joint Operations, Deputy Chief Borders Division, Baghdad, Iraq where he worked with the Iraqi Ministers of Interior and Defense to assist the Iraqi government with securing its borders and boosting economic prosperity.
